

## **Minutes of the 6-8-15 Hampton City Council Workshop**

The Hampton City Council held a workshop at 6:00 pm in city council chambers. Members present; Davies, Pralle, Hickman, Lukensmeyer and Freie. Absent; Harms. Also present were Mayor Boehmler, City Manager Ron Dunt, Public Works Director Doug Tarr and Police Chief Bob Schaefer.

Public Comment: Mayor Boehmler introduced special guests, the Sara Dunn Band who will be performing at Tuesday on the Town tomorrow. Mayor Boehmler then introduced Mike Betton of Hampton and recognized Mike with a Mayoral Proclamation honor his commitment to the community. Newton Grotzinger, GFCCC then invited everyone to the Tuesday on the Town event tomorrow evening at Band Shell Park and expressed his gratitude to Deputy City Clerk Robbi Stevens for her efforts working with him and La Frontera in working through the details of their permitting process.

Clay Miller, Hampton Fire Department addressed the council with an update of the condition of their current brush buggy which is a 1983 pickup truck with water tank mounted in the bed. He indicated that the truck needs to be replaced soon and is seeking to work with the council to purchase a new ¾ ton quad cab pickup. The Mayor summarized the budget process and the many potential options for proceeding were discussed. The fire department extended an invitation to the council and mayor to visit the fire station after the June 22<sup>nd</sup> council workshop.

There had been a citizen inquire if the old play structure at Harriman Park could be transferred and used at Memorial Park. After much discussion the consensus was to have city staff offer the structure for sealed bid to anyone interested with the requirement that a bidder would agree to remove the structure completely between July 10-15. Full removal must be completed by July 15<sup>th</sup>. Ron also informed the council that the William Robinson III Estate had donated \$3,288.66 towards the Enid H. Robinson Memorial Park. The council will be considering how these funds will be used.

Ron handed out a draft of an ordinance amendment which would add another limited parking space in the 10 block of 1<sup>st</sup> St SW in front of the Senior Citizen Center. The first reading of the ordinance will be held at the June 10<sup>th</sup> meeting.

Under old business Ron updated the council on the library curved wall project and the airport hangar rehabilitation project.

Mayor adjourned the workshop meeting at 6:57 p.m.
